





Disembark after the scenic climb, and take on an easy hike that guides you to the revered Five Fingers viewing platform, perched at 2,700 metres in the Dachstein Krippenstein.

Designed to resemble a stretched-out hand, this architectural marvel, also featuring a transparent glass bottom platform, is suspended 400 metres above the valley floor. The viewing point offers sensational, unobstructed views of nature's grandeur, comprising endless snow-covered Alpine peaks, the deep blue Hallstättersee lake, and the sheer rush of adrenaline that comes with the thrilling elevation.





Hop on the Cable Car to the Top of Nordkette

Nestled in the lap of the Austrian Alps is the marvellous city of Innsbruck. A slight gaze above eye level from anywhere in the city reveals the beautiful, snow-clad mountains acting as the dramatic backdrop to its varied coloured buildings.
